▲ **H.R.1157 Freedom to Read Protection Act of 2003**

To amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act to exempt bookstores and libraries from orders requiring the production of any tangible things for certain foreign intelligence investigations, and for other purposes.

Sponsor: Sanders, Bernard [VT] (introduced 3/6/2003) **Cosponsors:** 138

▲ **H.R.2429 Surveillance Oversight and Disclosure Act of 2003**

To amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 to improve the administration and oversight of foreign intelligence surveillance, and for other purposes.

Sponsor: Hoeffel, Joseph M. [PA-13] (introduced 6/11/2003) **Cosponsors:** 24

▼ **H.R.3037 Antiterrorism Tools Enhancement Act of 2003**

To strengthen antiterrorism investigative tools, and for other purposes.

Sponsor: Feeney, Tom [FL-24] (introduced 9/9/2003) **Cosponsors:** none

Note: Extends use of administrative subpoenas by FBI.

▼ **H.R.3179 Anti-Terrorism Intelligence Tools Improvement Act of 2003**

To strengthen anti-terrorism investigative tools and promote information sharing, and for other purposes.

Sponsor: Sensenbrenner, F. James, Jr. [WI-5] (introduced 9/25/2003) **Cosponsors:** 1

Note: Spells out punishment for violating gag order on "National Security Letters."

▲ **H.R.3352 Security and Freedom Ensured (SAFE) Act of 2003**

A bill to amend the USA PATRIOT ACT to place reasonable limitations on the use of surveillance and the issuance of search warrants, and for other purposes.

Sponsor: Rep Otter, C. L. (Butch) [ID-1] (introduced 10/21/2003) **Cosponsors:** 11

▼ **S.113**

A bill to amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 to cover individuals, other than United States persons, who engage in international terrorism without affiliation with an international terrorist group.

Sponsor: Sen Kyl, Jon [AZ] (introduced 1/9/2003) **Cosponsors:** 8

▼ **S.123**

A bill to exclude United States persons from the definition of "foreign power" under the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 relating to international terrorism.

Sponsor: Sen Kyl, Jon [AZ] (introduced 1/9/2003) **Cosponsors:** none

▲ **S.436 Domestic Surveillance Oversight Act of 2003**

A bill to amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 to improve the administration and oversight of foreign intelligence surveillance, and for other purposes.

Sponsor: Sen Leahy, Patrick J. [VT] (introduced 2/25/2003) **Cosponsors:** 6

▲ **S.1158 Library and Bookseller Protection Act**

A bill to exempt bookstores and libraries from orders requiring the production of tangible things for foreign intelligence investigations, and to exempt libraries from counterintelligence access to certain records, ensuring that libraries and bookstores are subjected to the regular system of court-ordered warrants.

Sponsor: Sen Boxer, Barbara [CA] (introduced 5/23/2003) **Cosponsors:** none

▲ **S.1507 Library, Bookseller, and Personal Records Privacy Act**

A bill to protect privacy by limiting the access of the government to library, bookseller, and other personal records for foreign intelligence and counterintelligence purposes.

Sponsor: Sen Feingold, Russell D. [WI] (introduced 7/31/2003) **Cosponsors:** 11

▲ **S.1552 Protecting the Rights of Individuals Act**

A bill to amend title 18, United States Code, and the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 to strengthen protections of civil liberties in the exercise of the foreign intelligence surveillance authorities under Federal law, and for other purposes.

Sponsor: Sen Murkowski, Lisa [AK] (introduced 7/31/2003) **Cosponsors:** 1

▲ **S.1695 PATRIOT Oversight Restoration Act of 2003**

A bill to provide greater oversight over the USA PATRIOT Act.

Sponsor: Sen Leahy, Patrick J. [VT] (introduced 10/1/2003) **Cosponsors:** 5

▲ **S.1701 Reasonable Notice and Search Act**

A bill to limit authority to delay notice of search warrants.

Sponsor: Sen Feingold, Russell D. [WI] (introduced 10/2/2003) **Cosponsors:** none

▲ **S.1709 Security and Freedom Ensured (SAFE) Act of 2003**

A bill to amend the USA PATRIOT ACT to place reasonable limitations on the use of surveillance and the issuance of search warrants, and for other purposes.
