Incorporation

On October 23 AACRL President Tim Dodge walked into the Lee County Courthouse and then into the Judge of Probate's office to file the State of Alabama Domestic Non-Profit Corporation Articles of Incorporation for our Association. This fulfills the mandate of ACRL that all 42 state and regional chapters be either incorporated or merged with state library associations by December 31, 2000.

The actual incorporation process turns out to be quite simple. Two copies of the Articles of Incorporation need to be filed in the county where the corporation's office is located. There is a \$20 filing fee for the

Secretary of State and a variable Judge of Probate's filing fee that happens to be \$30 for Lee County.

Although the composition of the AACRL Executive Board changes each year, the Secretary of State requires a street address and an official registered agent for a non-profit organization. Since AACRL has no physical office and since I am AACRL President this year, it is appropriate that I serve as the registered agent.

For incorporation purposes, AACRL's office is currently located in my house in rural Waverly, Alabama. It is possible to change the registered agent for a modest fee to the Secretary of State. Perhaps the AACRL Bylaws now need a provision allowing for the periodic changing of the registered agent. In addition to serving as registered agent, I am also the official incorporator of AACRL and one of three directors. President-Elect Jean Thomason and Treasurer Susan Herring are also listed as directors.

AACRL has met the December 31 deadline for incorporation or merging with state library associations mandated by ACRL. Still to be determined is the need for a financial audit for federal and state income tax purposes.

AACRL Bylaws

As last year's AACRL election approached, the Executive Board began preparing to distribute the ballots and tally the votes. At that time we discovered an apparent conflict in the Bylaws regarding the timing of the membership's voting for new officers. According to Article VI, Section 2, the officers "shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Association." However, Article IX, Section 3 says "Election of officers shall be by mail ballot prior to the annual chapter meeting." Since the beginning of my involvement with AACRL, the election has been conducted according to Article IX, Section 3. That has made it possible for the new officers to be presented at the annual business meeting. Thus, by our practice we have established this as an effective and efficient procedure.

In order that the Bylaws

might accurately reflect the established practice of the association, President Tim Dodge appointed a committee composed of Jennifer Long (Sterne Library, UAB) and me to investigate the conflict and, if necessary, propose a solution. What follows in the next two paragraphs is the substance of our report to the Board.

Two observations: First, Article IX, Section 3 makes more sense in terms of timing of the election, because it allows us to have a list of newly-elected officers to announce at the annual business meeting. Second, the first sentence in Article VI, Section 2, which includes the statement about electing officers at the meeting, actually adds nothing to the Bylaws. That's because Section 1 says the officers must be members of ACRL, and because Section 2 later states that the Newsletter Editor is an appointed position.

Our conclusion is that the first sentence of Article VI. Section 2 is redundant and unnecessary, and that removing it will resolve the conflict and will not adversely affect the Bylaws. Therefore, our recommendation is that we remove the aforementioned sentence. [For reference, the sentence reads "The officers, with the exception of the Newsletter Editor, shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Association from the membership of the chapter who are members of ACRL."]

Now the Board must review and vote on the recommended change to the Bylaws before presenting it to the membership for final approval. Their vote will likely take place at the next meeting of the Executive Board in January 2001.
