Treasurer's Report March 1, 2012

The account balance for the November 7, 2011 Treasurer's Report was \$3,940.95. Since then, deposits totaling \$1095.00 have been made. This amount includes a \$735.00 reimbursement from NAAL for the fall workshop and \$360.00 in membership dues. In the time it took to change our account with BB&T from an interest bearing account to a free community checking account, we accrued \$.36 in interest and \$51.00 in service changes. The account balance as of March 1, 2012 was \$4.985.31.

As of March 8th I have received 20 renewals and 4 new members for 2012. We currently have 58 members in good standing.
